2024 4-H Ontario Volunteer Conference was held in Richmond Hill March 22 & 23 at the Sheraton Parkway Hotel with the theme the 'Building Connections 4 Brighter Horizons' hosted by Region 1.

I attended the Annual Meeting virtually Friday night along with about 100 conference delegates in-person. The President, Laurie Farquharson, chaired the meeting. The Directors election resulted with Debbie Coke, Tamara Fisher-Cullen, Erica Murray, Brian O'Neil, Jennifer Waldroff and Edna White being elected. The other Directors are Penny Anger, Lesleigh Elgie, Joanne Hewitson, Fred Sharpe and Laurie Farquharson. Alice Van Vugt is Youth Director, Nav Sadhra is the Director Community and Mary Brander is the 4-H Canada Youth Advisory Council Director. Outgoing Directors, Cheryl Sullivan, Elaine Bowman and Kayla Emmerton were thanked for their service on the Council board. The new President is Erica Murray, Vice-President is Jennifer Waldroff, Director at Large is Lesleigh Elgie and Past President is Laurie Farquharson. The next AGM is March 2024 with place to be determined. The conference kickoff was done by Region 1 Chair Elaine Bowman following the AGM.

On March 23rd Kirsten Dill, Christy Brekelmans and I drove to the conference to learn new information and meet with volunteers in-person for the Saturday. We started our day with breakfast followed by hearing the keynote speaker 'Andrew Campbell', 4-H volunteer, dairy farmer & FreshAir Media from Glencoe. Andrew talked about the Value of Connecting: How to build a personal brand and network that you can use with five ways to build a strong and valuable network: Opportunities, Collaboration, Mentorship, Diversity & Relationships. Each person had to list 3 words that you want people to describe you as; later these words were shared with delegate attendees at the table you were sitting at.

Conference delegates went to their respective Regional JAM session. Melinda led the Region 6 session with hearing about events & news from each of the Region 6 associations. The Region 6 financials were also approved.

The first workshop I attended was 'Positive Youth Development'. Leslie Noble, Program Director with 4-H Canada talked about the '4-H Canada PYD Formula'. With 4-H youth being in a safe, fun, inclusive environment with caring adults and learning to do by doing.....youth develop positive values, responsibility, skill mastery, leadership, sense of purpose, planning & decision making to become responsible, caring and contributing leaders.

During lunch, the 2023 4-H Ontario Ambassadors spoke about their community projects they had done, like promoting 4-H at fairs & parades, donating to food banks. They were then recognized with a wooden clock. The 2024 4-H Ontario Ambassadors were introduced Abby Covert (Northumberland), Beck Sommerville (Waterloo), Colin Ormiston (Wellington), Haleigh-Jo tePlate (Stormont), Kayla Emmerton (Peel) and Rachael Simpson (Hastings) who are available to support 4-H events/activities throughout the province.

The second workshop I attended was 'Volunteer Recruitment at the Local Level' with Faith Kirk, 4-H Ontario Staff talking about the 4 R's.....Recruitment, Retention, Recognition, Relationships. Each table talked about ideas for each "R" and shared with the whole group via sticky notes with each "R".

The third workshop I attended was 'Spotlight on 2024 4-H Projects' presented by Elizabeth Johnston. 2024 project releases are Cultural Diversity (updated), Eye on Energy (updated) and A World of Food in Canada and Real Dirt on Farming (updated), along with 3 new Cloverbud units, A World of Food in Canada, Cultural Diversity and Eye on Energy, added to Year Three of Cloverbud curriculum. We played a Kahoot game reviewing information during the workshop—I placed 3<sup>rd</sup>. We were able to sample some of the food recipes from the projects at the end. The 2025 project releases are 'On Your Own You Can Do It' update and 'Sheep' update.

A chicken dinner was enjoyed before the 4-H Ontario Arbor Award banquet recognizing Suzanne Barker (Kawartha Lakes Haliburton) and Darrell Bergsma (Huron) for their volunteer service. Seventeen Arbor Award recipients since 2001 attending were recognized including Oxford attendee myself. There was a silent auction Friday night and during the day on Saturday with many gift baskets and other items available to bid on. The Live Auction by Scott Bessey followed the award presentation with lots of bidders for the unique items, some handcrafted by 4-H members, volunteers & clubs. Lucas Rogerson Band performed after the live auction for the evening entertainment.

The 4-H Ontario Volunteer Conference is a great way to meet volunteers from across the province to reflect on what 4-H projects/events are happening and how volunteers can use ideas they have heard from others in their own 4-H activities. **Applesauce Muffins** (Ontario Tasty Fruits & Vegetables 4-H project), three muffins on a disposable plate in a Ziploc bag,

1 cup (250 mL) all-purpose flour

1 cup (250 mL) oatmeal (not instant)

1 tsp (5 mL) baking powder

¼ tsp (1 mL) baking soda

¼ tsp (1 mL) salt

1 tsp (5 mL) cinnamon

½ cup (125 mL) raisins

½ cup (125 mL) butter

34 cup (175 mL) brown sugar

1 egg

34 cup (175 mL) unsweetened applesauce

Preheat oven to 350°F (180°C).

Place paper liners in muffin tins.

Using a wire whisk and a large mixing bowl, mix together flour, oatmeal, baking powder, baking soda, salt, and cinnamon. Add raisins. Set aside.

Using electric mixer and medium sized mixing bowl, cream butter and brown sugar until light and fluffy.

Beat in egg. Then mix in applesauce. Disconnect electric mixer and set aside.

Make a well in the centre of the dry ingredients by pushing dry ingredients to the sides leaving a hole in the middle.

Pour liquid mixture into the well and stir using a fork, just until all the ingredients are combined.

Scoop batter into paper-lined muffin tins using ice-cream scoop.

Bake for about 20 - 25 minutes.
