

Regional Go For the Gold Results

There was no buzzers to jump on or team members to confer with, but Hensall 4-H Members participated in a virtual Go for the Gold quiz competition on August 24th with other 4-H members from Region 5. Lauren Bos, Dugald McIntosh, Mercedes Prout and Lily Shapton made up the Huron team. These were the highest scoring participants from our



Local Go For the Gold that was held on July 21st, organized by Marita Oudshoorn.

Using 2 devices the members listened to 60 different questions from 4-H Ontario staff on Zoom and then put their answers in on Kahoot. Points were given on correct answers and speed. As the competition moved along, the speed increased! All members did an excellent job in a very different Go for the Gold environment. Lauren Bos scored 3rd overall for points. Following the 4-H motto, 'Learn to Do by Doing', Hensall 4-H members did just that! Well done!

Electronics Drive

Our annual Electronics Drive was held on September 5th at the Hensall District Co-op in Londesborough. With COVID-19 precautions in place, donors were able to safely drop off their broken electronics and support this important Huron County 4-H fundraiser. Thank you to everyone who participated!

This was the 7th year that Darrell Bergsma has organized the event, along with Reg Vinnicombe. Over the years, we have collected 22,383 kg of electronics and raised more than \$4000. Many thanks to Darrell and Reg for their work running yet another successful drive!







4-H Virtual Judging Competition 2020—Lots of firsts!

Huron County partnered with Region 5 (Grey, Bruce & Perth counties) for the first time ever to host an on-line judging competition. Videos of judging guidelines were posted on the Huron County 4-H Facebook page for 3 weeks prior to competition going live on August 17. Anyone, whether a current 4-H member or not, could try judging. The Virtual Judging Competition was open for a full week, and there were over 150 people across the province who submitted placings. Two other 4-H regions also had virtual judging competitions, however, Huron County was the first competition open to not only 4-H members but parents, former members, family and folks who just wanted to try their hand at judging.

The 6 judging classes were all professionally filmed in Huron County by Faux Pop Media. Thanks to our livestock judges, Keith Todd, Brad Gilchrist and Curtis MacNeil, for preparing the excellent calibre of sheep, beef and dairy animal classes and giving official reasons. There were also classes of eggs, photography and torque wrenches thanks to Barb McIntosh, Nick Vinnicombe and Reg Vinnicombe. All of the judges did an outstanding job presenting reasons in their first screen debut — a great example for 4-H members to follow.

Many missed getting together to judge live animals as well as enjoying snacks and social time afterward. However, in the virtual judging videos, we got a taste of something new – beef heifers were walking and running in a field setting, tools were being used and participants got to judge a full mammary system on a mature dairy cow. There was also less stress for the livestock, and less work for owners, not to have to truck animals off farm in hot weather to the competition site. Different can be good.

For the first time ever, results were broadcast in a livestream on the evening of August 31. This provided official reasons and quiz answers, just like on judging night. Although, 4-H membership is down considerably due to the current pandemic, in Huron County, we had about 30 participants; 8 of those were current 4-H members, the rest former members and alumni. There were also guest appearances from Sandy Brock and Senator Rob Black. The 4-H Ambassadors provided judging support videos and 4-H members submitted some great videos on why they love 4-H!
