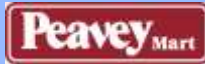

Some South Simcoe 4-H History

Reach for the Top was developed in Peterborough County in the early 1980's and in 1982, they hosted a provincial competition. In 1989, the competition name was changed to Go for the Gold. This year South Simcoe has brought back a Go for the Gold club, but this is not the first of its kind in South Simcoe. Back on August 9 & 11, 1988, there was a Reach for the Top Competition and members from the South Simcoe crops club, swine club, and sheep club participated and I am sure there were others. In the end, the members of the South Simcoe 4-H Swine club were crowned champions. On that winning team was John Watt, Mike Dodd, Katherine Kell and Stephen Kell.

Throughout Chess Club this year we have been learning many things. We have been learning how to play chess and how to determine how many points a chess piece is worth, some strategies of how to play chess and how to create opportunities to capture your opponent's pieces. After each meeting we would have a fun little tournament on ChessKid.com to test out our skills. On Achievement Day we did a bigger tournament on ChessKid.com where we faced each other in a larger tournament to demonstrate our skills that we had learned this year in Chess Club. I think that Chess Club is a good way to get better at playing chess and having fun playing a competitive game.

Vet Medicine Club – from Milana Palmateer’s Press Reports

The Vet Medicine Club was a large club lead for the first time by Grant Cowan, Jackie McCallum, Trish Downey, Scott Cullen, and Tamara Fisher-Cullen. Members in this club were not only from South Simcoe but because it was a virtual club, there were also a handful of border hoppers. This club began at the end of February and most meetings had a guest speaker. Those speakers included Kirsti Clarida, Tara Kleyn, and Dr. Christie Ryan. Members learned how to give injections to animals, all about infectious diseases, medical situations that are considered an emergency and intramuscular and subcutaneous. Milana would recommend this club to those who are interested in animals and how their bodies work. During the last meeting, the members went behind the scenes at the Toronto Zoo via Zoom to see what goes on daily to care for all of the animals at the zoo. The members learned that even at the zoo, there are lots of x-rays, examinations, vaccinations, dentistry and check-ups.

Cooking Club – from Nicole Palmateer’s Press Reports

This year’s cooking club started in early April and completed their 6 meetings by the end of May. The club was quite large once again and looked like a virtual cooking show with leaders demonstrating how to make various recipes and the members following along at home. This usually meant that the families of all of these 4-H members would have a delicious lunch by the time they were through. One Saturday was spent making garlic chicken ranch pizza while another Saturday had a guest speaker who taught the members how to make royal icing and decorate some very delicious looking cookies.

Maple Syrup Club – from Abby Patton’s Press Reports

Maple Syrup club was new to South Simcoe this year and was led by Greg Bray, Nadina Bray and Scott Cullen. Each week focused on one aspect of the maple syrup process starting with identifying the trees that are able to be tapped and then how to successfully tap them. Members shared weekly how successful their collection of sap was going and were able to provide the other members with tips and tricks. Greg was able to show the members the set up they have at home and what process they use to boil the sap down into sweet liquid gold. During the second last meeting, the members learned all about bottling the syrup and grading it. They also learned about labelling a product and what the label must contain. For an achievement day, the members either presented their personal maple syrup journey through pictures or they shared their delicious baking and cooking ideas with maple syrup. Recipes such as Maple Beachcomber Pie and Maple BBQ Ribs were a couple of unique ones. Overall a very sweet club. The leaders plan to run this club in early 2022 so if you missed out this year, be sure to look for details in January or February 2022.

Animal Friends Club – Carla Williams

The Animal Friends club was new to South Simcoe this year and it was geared towards our youngest and newest members. We had 7 members all of whom were under the age of 13. The club learned all about domestic pets - how to choose one, what they eat, how to care for them and how to groom them. We had one guest speaker, Paige Presswood, who spoke about fostering puppies. The members thoroughly enjoyed our Kahoot games at the end of each meeting but they especially loved being able to meet in-person on June 19 for our achievement day. They presented their collage, ate pizza lunch, ran some animals through the obstacle courses and just had some fun.
