Send members a list of tools and supplies needed for each meeting.

Create a Safety Agreement

As a group create a safety agreement for all members to sign to ensure that they are keeping themselves, their environment, and their fellow members safe.

Utilize Household Machines

Focus on engines and machines that are common in households. For example: blender, sewing machine, lawn mower, etc.

Out of the Box

Host your meeting from your farm or your guest speakers' farm.
