Impact Conference 2023 - Two South Simcoe Perspectives



The Impact Conference is a 4-H Ontario leadership opportunity for youth from ages 15 to 21. I was lucky enough to be selected to go to the conference and to learn. On the first night, we did icebreakers and a run through of the next day's agenda. Then we had free time and got to socialize with our fellow 4-Hers. I met new friends and saw old ones that I've had the chance to meet at past 4-H events.

A highlight of the conference was the first day when we played a huge game of spoons. We sat in a circle with 30 of us passing around cards and reaching for spoons! We attended sessions which included succession planning, "What fuels your passions", agricultural jobs in government, etc. I took a lot away from these sessions and was sad I had to pick between 2 each time. Another highlight was the socializing on the final night. I had gotten a group of my friends together and we started line dancing. Soon after, most of the 4-Hers were learning to line dance. When that was over, some of us learned square dancing too.*

In the morning we talked with 4-H Ontario employees and were asked questions about our experiences in 4-H. Then the part I hate - the ending. I said my goodbyes knowing I'd see my 4-H friends soon either at the Royal or hopefully at the next 4-H Ontario event.

I left the conference with an idea of a future job, friendships, contacts for more people in the agriculture industry and lots of memories. The conference made an impact. From October 13-15 2023, I had the opportunity to attend 4-H Ontario's first ever Youth Impact Conference in Oakville, along with 3 other members of South Simcoe. On Friday night we arrived at the Holiday Inn, checked in, met our roommates and went back down stairs for the rules of the conference and activities. We even played about a 30 person round of spoons before heading off to bed to get ready for business casual the following morning.



Saturday was the actual business part of the conference. Before we started our sessions for the day, we listened to Drew Dudly where he talked to us about leadership. We had sessions where we had the opportunity to listen to 3 out of the 6 speakers. Each of the speakers talked about jobs in agriculture, how they got there, and then what they do.

Personally I chose to hear from Bruce Sargent and his session on AG Careers in Marketing and Media. Bruce talked about what he does and how he does photo shoots for businesses in Ag for their advertisements along with his work on his family's Dairy farm and the business. The next session I listened to Jennifer Peart Anderson with young farmers. She talked about how you can apply for help when it comes to the start of farming and what all we need to be able to do so. She also gave us an up-to-date cost breakdown of running your own farm. Finally I listened to Annie Sanassion with Finding a Career that fuels your Passion. Annie talked about how when she was growing up she absolutely loved mushrooms and now she runs a farmers market where she sells certain types of mushrooms to help improve your health.

After the completion of our sessions, we had a social where we could go around and talk to the speakers, sponsors and others with careers in agriculture to get a more in-depth answer to the questions we had. Following the social, we had a career panel where some of the speakers from the social and our sessions were asked more questions about their jobs and then questions from the youth. Of course we had to end our conference with a bang! With the help of the South Simcoe Line Dancing club and members of different county's Line Dancing clubs, we line danced for a few hours and then headed up for bed.

Sunday was our very last day and we reflected on what we learned the prior day. We also had the opportunity to have a say in what the future of 4-H should be by providing input into the next 5-year plan. Friendships were made that will last a lifetime, many of us have talked every day since the conference ended.

My favourite part of the conference would have to be Saturday night's line dancing. Nobody judged you if you didn't know how to dance, you were taught. Signing and dancing filled the conference room and even the chaperones joined in on some of the dances.
